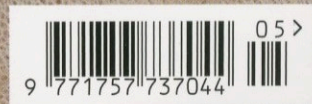

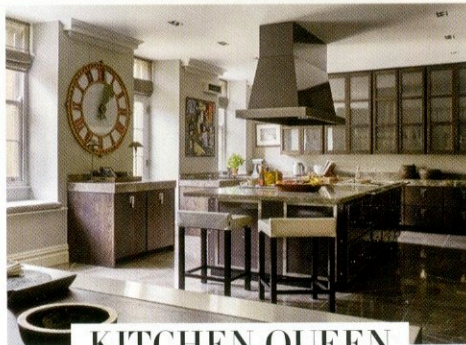
PLUMB JOB
