

He looks more like a banker than a craftsman, but this Iranian designer has confounded tradition to create one of the year's most beautiful collections

bandoning his career to pursue his passion was no leap of faith for Hossein Rezvani. The age old tradition of weaving carpets was in his blood. From Iranian descent, it was almost natural that his focus settled on the iconic Persian carpet and a compulsion to reinvent it, to give it a modern context. His family had been in the carpet business for three generations, so Hossein took to the road with his father, visiting traditional weavers, using a natural eye for design and innovation to give his father's knowledge new life. In 2008 he quit his job and began designing the first ever contemporary collection of Persian carpets. Three years later and he has travelled the world, acquiring a wealth of inspiration and ideas along the way. His work has been awarded, and the beautiful, fractured carpets widely acclaimed, loved for their raw beauty and originality.

HOW DOES YOUR CULTURAL BACKGROUND INFORM YOUR WORK?

My family is from Iran but my father moved to Germany in the early 60's, and over the years we traveled extensively, discovering different cultures, so of course these are all evident in my work. I like the clean, minimalist European style, but on the other hand I love the Middle Eastern aesthetic, so I always try to mix these elements. Personally, I think it is a gift to have experienced such diversity and to distill this into your work, it's just fabulous.

WHAT IS YOUR DESIGN PHILOSOPHY?

Trends come and go, but the classics remain, that's my philosophy. I wanted to reinterpret an ancient tradition for the third millennium, to create a true modern classic that endures.

HOW HAVE YOU EVOLVED AS AN ARTIST?


My first collection, the Design collection was very abstract and noisy, using bright colors and strong patterns. This year I wanted to create something more neutral and to pay tribute to my Iranian heritage. It's the result of a whole process of growth that has lead me to take traditional patterns and play with them, to create designs with history.

TELL US ABOUT PERSIA REINVENTED?

Tabriz and Bakhtiar are patterns which have existed for more than 100 years. I have taken these ancient traditional patterns and minimized them, adapting the colours for a contemporary feel, but leaving the most

Of course every single piece is made by hand so if it sometimes takes a little longer to reach 100 per cent perfection, that's better. And of course, this handmade quality is reflected in the price.
